Suuri Armo (registered association) collects and maintains personal data registers in order to carry out the task defined in its rules and related services in the churches it maintains. This privacy statement is a register and data protection statement in accordance with the EU General Data Protection Regulation 2016/679. By 'register' we mean an information system in which personal data are processed.

Purpose and legality of the processing of personal data

The purpose of the processing is to manage internal communication, to initiate contact, to send anniversary greetings, and to provide services.

The legality is based on the express permission or consent of the person to be registered.

Personal data is not used for direct marketing. The processing does not involve data profiling or automated decision-making.

Data content of registers

The contact registers contain the first and last name and telephone number of those involved in the church's activities, optionally also the date of birth, e-mail address and street address. For minors the register stores the child's name, date of birth, food allergies and other necessary health information, as well as the contact details of the child's guardian.

Regular data sources

The data are collected from the data subject himself or his or her guardian with unequivocal consent. Information may be collected in registers at a church event or during evangelism using the personal data collection form, in writing at the time of registering to events, or electronically using separate forms. If the data subject wishes to disclose their contact information to only one contact person, they must give permission to store their data at least by supplementing the ready-made consent text message template and forwarding it to the person in question.

Regular disclosures and transfer of data outside the EU or the EEA

The data will be transferred outside Suuri Armo ry only to the extent that accounting obligations or official obligations require. The data will not be disclosed outside the EU or the EEA. The data may be stored in Microsoft Office 365 on servers located in the EU or EEA.

Storage period of personal data

The data will be retained until the data subject wishes to have it deleted or the data subject dies or loses his or her legal capacity. For children, the data is stored until the person reaches the age of 18 or if they or their guardian requests the removal from the register. Contact information can also be deleted at the initiative of the association, for example, when a person cannot be contacted despite attempts.

Register protection principles

In the churches maintained by Suuri Armo ry, manual material is stored in a locked space, access to which is restricted to those who need it to perform their tasks. Personal data in electronic format, with the exception of instant messaging groups, are stored in the association's secure cloud (which is protected by a firewall, usernames, and passwords) and in accounting, as applicable.

Access to the data in the registers is restricted to those who perform the controller's duties and who need the data. A confidentiality agreement is made with them.

Duty to inform

The privacy statement is published on the website www.raamattupuhuuturku.fi and in connection with the collection of personal data.

The data subject shall be informed without delay if the confidentiality, integrity, or availability of the register has been compromised so that it is likely to pose a high risk to the rights and freedoms of the data subject, for example in the form of identity theft, payment fraud, or other criminal activity. The necessary authorities are informed already when the data breach is detected.

Right to inspect and to demand rectification

Data subjects have the right to check their data stored in the personal data register, to correct any incorrect data, and to request the deletion of their data. The request must be made in writing to the controller's contact person. The applicant must prove his or her identity. The data subject has the right to lodge a complaint about the processing of their personal data with the Data Protection Ombudsman, P.O. Box 800, P.O.
