

Digital Media Registers Privacy Statement

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This privacy statement applies to the personal data register of Suuri Armo ry called Digital Media Registers.

Suuri Armo (registered association) collects and maintains personal data registers in order to carry out the task defined in its rules and related services in the churches it maintains. This privacy statement is a register and data protection statement in accordance with the EU General Data Protection Regulation 2016/679. By 'register' we mean an information system in which personal data are processed.

Purpose and legality of the processing of personal data

The purpose of the processing is to offer services.

Legality is based on the explicit permission or consent of the person to be registered.

Personal data is not used for direct marketing. The processing does not involve data profiling or automated decision-making.

Data content of registers

Digital media registers consist of sound recordings which are stored on the church's web server, and in some cases of video records which are stored on Youtube's servers. These are stored with an explicit permission of the person registered and with a permission under the copyright act.

Regular data sources

Data for the registers is collected from the data subject or their guardian with unequivocal consent or explicit permission. The collection of information typically takes place in connection with recording at church events.

Regular disclosures and transfer of data outside the EU or the EEA

When the weekly meetings and some other events are streamed, the Youtube website will show a video of the event. The YouTube video can be viewed outside the EU and the EEA. Continuous permission is asked from speakers, interpreters and performers, and visitors are asked to give an explicit permission to stream the event on Youtube or also to store and keep available the recording that YouTube has made in connection with the streaming. At the doorways of the room where the video stream is filmed, the participants will be told a place where they won't be streamed. The streaming link can be found on the website raamattupuhuuturku.fi.

Storage period of personal data

The association stores the personal data published in electronic media for the times specified in the permits it receives. Streamed videos are stored on a Youtube server, from where they are deleted within a week, unless explicitly agreed otherwise.

Register protection principles

The video is stored on the YouTube website. Audio recordings are also stored on the server of the

association's Internet website and on the association's computer. Information about the permits given is stored in a paper format in a locked space and in the association's secure cloud, which is protected by a firewall, usernames and passwords, and the association's computer. The security of the website's server platform and the security of Youtube are the responsibility of those service providers.

Duty to inform

The privacy statement is published on the website www.raamattupuhuuturku.fi and in connection with the collection of personal data.

The data subject shall be informed without delay if the confidentiality, integrity, or availability of the register has been compromised so that it is likely to pose a high risk to the rights and freedoms of the data subject, for example in the form of identity theft, payment fraud, or other criminal activity. The necessary authorities are informed already when the data breach is detected.

Right to inspect and to demand rectification

Data subjects have the right to check their data stored in the personal data register, to correct any incorrect data, and to request the deletion of their data. The request must be made in writing to the controller's contact person. The applicant must prove his or her identity. The data subject has the right to lodge a complaint about the processing of their personal data with the Data Protection Ombudsman, P.O. Box 800, P.O.
