This privacy statement applies to the personal data register of Suuri Armo ry called Membership Register.

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Suuri Armo (registered association) collects and maintains personal data registers in order to carry out the task defined in its rules and related services in the churches it maintains. This privacy statement is a register and data protection statement in accordance with the EU General Data Protection Regulation 2016/679. By 'register' we mean an information system in which personal data are processed.

Purpose and legality of the processing of personal data

The purpose of the processing is to verify membership, to send notices of meetings and newsletters, and to collect possible membership fees.

Recording the full name and domicile and the nationality of a member who is not a Finnish citizen is based on the Act (Act on the Associations 503/1989) and recording the e-mail address or address in a legitimate interest. Recording the date of birth and telephone number are based on consent.

Personal data is not used for direct marketing. The processing does not involve data profiling or automated decision-making.

Data content of registers

The full name and domicile of the member, optionally also the date of birth and the telephone number, are stored in the association's membership register. To deliver the meeting invitations to the member, the association will record the email address or, alternatively, the mail address. In addition, the nationality of a member who is not a Finnish citizen is recorded.

Regular data sources

The data of a member of the association is obtained from the member.

Regular disclosures and transfer of data outside the EU or the EEA

The data will be transferred outside Suuri Armo ry only to the extent that accounting obligations or official obligations require. The data will not be disclosed outside the EU or the EEA. The data may be stored in Microsoft Office 365 on servers located in the EU or EEA.

All members of the association have the right to know the name and domicile of another member on a statutory basis. The information will be disclosed only to members upon request. Before this, members whose data is to be disclosed will be informed of the disclosure of the data. The member has the right to object to the disclosure of his or her data on the basis of a restraining order. In these cases, the member and the association can receive advice from the Digital Agency's Legal Department.

Storage period of personal data

A member may resign from the Association by giving written notice to the Board of the Association or its Chairman or by giving notice at the meeting of the Association to be recorded in the minutes. The data will be deleted when the management of membership matters no longer requires the

storage of the data.

Register protection principles

In the churches maintained by Suuri Armo ry, manual material is stored in a locked space, access to which is restricted to those who need it to perform their tasks. Personal data in electronic format, with the exception of instant messaging groups, are stored in the association's secure cloud (which is protected by a firewall, usernames, and passwords) and in accounting, as applicable.

Access to the data in the registers is restricted to those who perform the controller's duties and who need the data. A confidentiality agreement is made with them.

Duty to inform

The privacy statement is published on the website www.raamattupuhuuturku.fi and in connection with the collection of personal data.

The data subject shall be informed without delay if the confidentiality, integrity, or availability of the register has been compromised so that it is likely to pose a high risk to the rights and freedoms of the data subject, for example in the form of identity theft, payment fraud, or other criminal activity. The necessary authorities are informed already when the data breach is detected.

Right to inspect and to demand rectification

Data subjects have the right to check their data stored in the personal data register, to correct any incorrect data, and to request the deletion of their data. The request must be made in writing to the controller's contact person. The applicant must prove his or her identity. The data subject has the right to lodge a complaint about the processing of their personal data with the Data Protection Ombudsman, P.O. Box 800, P.O.
